Call for Posters

A symposium focusing on long-lived bridges, jointly sponsored by the Transportation Research Board's Strategic Highway Research Program 2 (SHRP 2) and the Forum of European national Highway Research Laboratories (FEHRL), has been organized within the Transport Research Arena (TRA 2010) conference that will take place this June in Brussels, Belgium. - Overview of work in progress in SHRP 2's bridge renewal research projects
- Presentations on related work in Europe
- Questions by presenters seeking guidance from attendees

This is a call for posters on Long Lived Bridges. Authors are now invited to submit 200 word abstracts to bridgesymposium@fehrl.org by 17:00 Central European Time, on Friday 30th April 2010.

Posters can be on any topic related to Long Lived Bridges, including:

- New, more durable materials for bridges
- Non-destructive testing
- Reliability analysis and modelling

After the keynote presentations on the afternoon of Tuesday 8th June, delegates at the joint symposium will be invited to visit the poster session. Authors are requested to attend at that time to discuss the content of their posters with delegates.

The purpose of this symposium is to enable SHRP2 and FEHRL researchers to report to the bridges and structures community on the status of ongoing research, and for them to seek comments and advice from each other and the attendees on their incomplete work that will enhance the chances of success of these projects and improve the quality of their results.
